In Memoriam



J. CARLTON NASH, 32° SECRETARY

Once more the Funeral Knell has tolled, this time to signal the passing of our genial and respected Secretary, Brother J. Carlton Nash, 32°. While it is true that members are always saddened at the announcement of the death of a brother, the news of Brother Carl's untimely passing came as a far greater shock, not only because of its unexpectedness, but because in his position as secretary he was so well known to so many of the brethren.



Brother Carl was attending the Scranton-Dunmore Keystone Consistory Club Dinner at the Castle Restaurant in Scranton on Friday evening, October 22, and was stricken fatally while seated at the table. Death was instant and thus it can be said, literally, that he died while at his work giving the last minutes of his life to the service of the Fraternity he loved so much.

Born in Taylor, Pennsylvania, on December 10, 1914, he lived in that community all his life. He became a member of Acacia Lodge No. 579 on April 18, 1960; joined Keystone Consistory on May 24, 1969, and became Secretary of the Four Bodies in March, 1978. Although in terms of years of membership Brother Carl might not be classified as a veteran member of Scottish Rite Masonry, yet in the relatively short time he served as Secretary, he quickly endeared himself to everyone by his careful and precise attention to the efficient management of the Valley office, as well as by his steadily increasing interest and activity in Scottish Rite functions. This willingness to serve when asked can be attested to by the fact that in addition to his many and varied duties as Secretary, he readily accepted the arduous responsibility of serving as Building Manager of Masonic Temple when asked to do so.

That he might be classified as indispensable can not be supposed, since there is no such thing as an indispensable man, but it can be said in all truthfulness that his absence will be noticeably apparent for a long, long time. His pleasant smile, his engaging personality and his unflinching sense of good humor will long be remembered, as will the efficiency with which he conducted the business of the office.

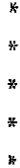
Our hearts go out with heartfelt sympathy to Jane, his charming and ever patient wife, as well as to the remainder of his family.

The Valley of Scranton extends sincere congratulations to Brother Ernest H. Dove on being the oldest living member of Keystone Consistory. Brother Dove celebrated his 100th birthday on July 2, 1976.

Brother Dove was born in Denver, Colorado, which is now celebrating its 100th year as a state, and, he has the distinction of being the last baby born in the territory of Colorado before it became a state.

He was honored by the Governor of Colorado with an invitation to go West and participate in their Centennial program, and up until a short time before the starting date he was planning to make the trip. Unfortunately he fell in his home and fractured a hip which precluded the possibilities of his making the trip.

Brother Dove moved to the Scranton area in 1900 with his wife Winifred, (now deceased) because she had a heart condition which was aggravated by Denver's high altitude.

Despite his advanced years he enjoys life, and, prior to his fall, he took care of his garden and yard, and he also attended his church (Assembly United Methodist Church) every Sunday. He also cast his vote in the last election saying that it is a "man's civic obligation".

Upon arriving in Scranton, his first thoughts were on looking for employment which was soon forthcoming at the I.C.S. in setting-up algebra problems in type. From there he went with The Scranton Times and worked under its founder the late E. J. Lynett. Later he worked for the Sam York Printing Company but left there to join the Eureka Speciality Printing Company which was then located on Lackawanna Avenue. He was with the Eureka for 48 years prior to his retirement.

Commenting on his long life, Brother Dove credits it to a lot of hard work, spending summers in the mountains and an even temperament. He says he never held a grudge or a hate, and he enjoys things as they occurred on a day-to-day basis.

In his early life he enjoyed fishing, bowling and playing a little pinochle after the meetings of the Odd Fellows Lodge No. 296. In 1966 he received a 50-year plaque from Green Ridge Lodge of Masons No. 597, and he also holds 50-year memberships in Lackawanna Royal Arch Chapter No. 185, 44 Royal and Select Masters, Melita-Coeur De Lion No. 17 and Irem Temple A.A.O.N.M.S. In May of 1977 he will receive his 50-year membership in the Valley of Scranton, 32°.

Brother Dove has one daughter, Mrs. Winifred McKay, who lives in Hartford, Connecticut. He enjoys visits with her and his two grandchildren and 15 great grandchildren.

Congratulations to Brother Dove from the Officers and members of Keystone Consistory. We salute you on your centennial birthday.
