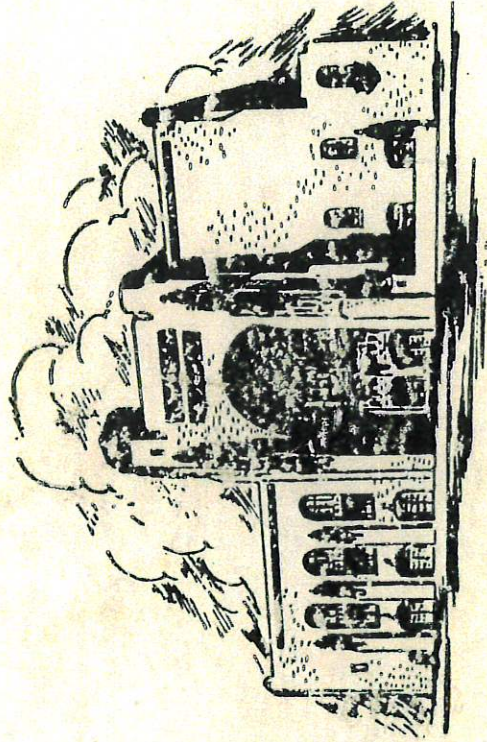

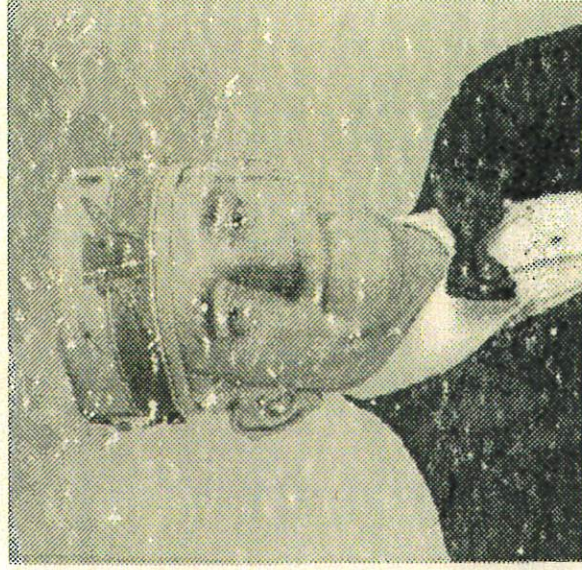

DECLARATION OF PRINCIPLES

BY THE

Supreme Council of Sovereign Grand Inspectors General
Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite of Freemasonry
For the Northern Masonic Jurisdiction of the
United States of America

This Supreme Council reaffirms its unswerving loyalty to the fundamental purpose of Freemasonry, which purpose from time immemorial has been to improve and strengthen the character of the individual man, and through the individual, the character of the community, thus undergirding the community with those spiritual values which give it strength and stability.

This Supreme Council believes that this purpose is to be attained by laying a broad basis of principle upon which men of every race, country, sect and opinion may unite.

Believing that good and true men can be trusted to act well and wisely, this Supreme Council considers it the duty of the Fraternity to impress upon its members the principles of personal righteousness and personal responsibility, to enlighten them as to those things which make for human welfare, and to inspire them with that feeling of charity, or well-wishing, toward all mankind which will move them to translate principle and conviction into action.

To that end Freemasonry teaches a belief in God and faith in His divine purposes. It encourages the worship of God in conformity with the dictates of individual conscience. It stands for truth and justice, liberty and enlightenment, fraternity and philanthropy.

This Supreme Council expects of its members strict obedience to the laws of the land, and respect for their country's flag.

Such principles unite men and encourage the pursuit by them individually and collectively of worthy endeavors and the attainment of the purposes inherent in them. In that unity human character achieves its highest unfolding and provides man's best hope for peace on earth and good will among men.

To the furtherance of these principles, all our ritual is directed and all our efforts are aimed. To their furtherance each Master Mason has pledged himself, and at the portal of the Scottish Rite has renewed that pledge.

This Supreme Council discounts and rejects any attempt by any international groups or confederations of Scottish Rite Supreme Councils to legislate for individual Supreme Councils.

Recognizing that principles unite men, that programs sometimes divide them, and that the preservation of unity of purpose and devotion to principle is essential to Freemasonry, the Supreme Council affirms its continued adherence to that ancient and approved rule of Freemasonry which forbids the discussion within tiled doors of creeds, politics, or other topics apt to excite personal animosities.

This Supreme Council further affirms its conviction that it is not only contrary to the fundamental principles of Freemasonry, but exceedingly dangerous to its unity, strength, usefulness and welfare for Masonic Bodies in their official capacity to take formal action or attempt to exercise pressure or influence for or against any particular legislative project or proposal, or in any way to attempt to procure the election or appointment of Governmental officials, whether executive, legislative or judicial, or to influence them, whether or not members of the Fraternity, in the performance of their official duties.

Ill. Boyd F. Buckingham, 33°, was born in York, Pennsylvania. He is a graduate of the public schools of York, Bloomsburg University, Bucknell University and Penn State University.

Brother Buckingham, served in the U.S. Army Air Corps from 1942, to 1945 where he was a B-17 Pilot for the 385th Bomb Group, E. T. O. He received the Air Medal with Cluster for the European Theater.

He was employed as a Teacher in Athens High School, Athens, Pa. from 1945-47, then became a Teacher in Sayre Area High School, Sayre, Pa. until 1953, was a part time radio announcer and news editor at Wats Radio, Sayre, Pa. from 1950 - 53. In 1953 he became a Asst. Prof. at Bloomsburg State Teacher College. In 1954 he became Assoc. Prof. and Director of Public Relations until 1964, from 1964 to 1970 he was Director of Development and in 1970 Assoc. Vice President, of Development and External Relations until 1981.

Brother Buckingham is a member of Rural Amity Lodge # 70, F. & A. M., of Athens, Pa. Joined Caldwell Consistory, Valley of Bloomsburg in 1957, where he became Dramatic Director in 1957. In 1981 to 1983 he was Commander-in-Chief and to this day he is on the Board of Trustees. He is also a member of York Rite Royal Arch Chapter #218, Bloomsburg, St. Moriah Council, R. & S. M. #10, Bloomsburg, Crusade Commandery #12, Knights Templar, Bloomsburg, Pa. York Rite College #11, Shamokin, Pa. Orient Conclave, Red Cross of Constantine, Bloomsburg and Honorary Member, Supreme Council, in September 1973.

His community activities are as follows: Bloomsburg Area Chamber of Commerce, Board of Directors, Bloomsburg Area Industrial Development Assoc. Board of Directors, Bloomsburg Chapter American Red Cross, Board of Directors, Family Counseling & Mental Health Clinic, Board of Directors, Columbia County Housing Authority, Board of Directors, First Federal Saving and Loan Association of Hazleton Advisory Board, Columbia Montour Torch Club, Jacques Weber Foundation, Inc., Board of Trustees, and B.P.O.E., of Bloomsburg Lodge #436.

Religious Affiliation: Served as Elder, Trustee and Deacon in Bloomsburg Presbyterian church, and Senior High Sunday School Teacher.

He has received the following Honors: Distinguished Service Award in 1973, from the Bloomsburg Area Chamber of Commerce, March 1984, and has had the Boyd Buckingham Maintenance Center dedicated in June 1986, at Bloomsburg University.

His hobbies are reading, bridge, traveling, gardening, golf, doing parts in degrees at Caldwell Consistory and Public Speaking.

Brother Buckingham is married to the former Joanna Fice. They have two children, Gail L. Worthington, and Atty. Boyd F. Buckingham, Jr., one granddaughter and twin grandsons.
